Accounting - ACC (AAS)

- This **occupational degree** is geared towards students intending to enter the workforce after two years.
- This program provides a basic knowledge of essential accounting/bookkeeping practices and procedures, preparing students for a variety of entry-level accounting positions.
- Program graduates gain employment in private and public sector positions, including bookkeeper, junior clerk, assistant auditor, cost accounting clerk, and assistant office manager.

Transfer Targets

- The ACC Program is an <u>occupational</u> program. It is not designed for transfer.
- Students planning to pursue a degree in accounting at a four-year school after completion of studies at DCC are encouraged to enroll in the Business Administration Transfer (BAT) Program.
- However, if a student decides to continue toward a fouryear degree in accounting after completing the ACC program, many of the courses already completed will apply toward that degree.

Bookkeeping - BOK (Certificate)

- This **certificate** is geared toward students intending to enter the workforce after one year, students already working in a related field/position, and/or careerchangers.
- This program prepares individuals for entry-level jobs as bookkeeping office employees, with opportunities for advancement to more responsible positions.
- If a student decides to continue toward a two-year degree in accounting (or another Business Department program), many of the courses already completed may be applied toward that degree.



Mighty Microcredentials

- Microcredentials verify, validate, and attest that specific skills and/or competencies have been achieved. They differ from traditional degrees and certificates in that they are generally offered in shorter or more flexible timespans and tend to be more narrowly focused.
- Microcredentials can be offered online, in the classroom, or via a hybrid of both.
- Any Microcredentials earned at DCC appear on the official DCC transcript, and the student also earns a "Digital Badge" allowing them to share the achievement with potential employers on professional networking sites.

Basic Bookkeeping - BBK (Microcredential)

- This **microcredential** is geared toward adult and nontraditional learners, including students already working in a related field/position and/or career-changers.
- They will possess entry-level bookkeeping/accounting skills immediately transferable into the workplace. Entrylevel jobs in bookkeeping often yield opportunities for advancement to more responsible positions.
- All courses are stackable into the **BOK** certificate, as well as the **ACC** and **BUS** programs.

Paralegal Degree and Certificate Programs

Department of Business, Aviation, and Construction Professions

Paralegal Degree Program - PAL (AAS)

- This occupational program is designed to provide students with knowledge and skills necessary to qualify for entry-level employment as paralegals.
- In general, paralegals work under the supervision of an attorney performing law-related tasks.
- These tasks may include drafting legal documents, performing legal research, and interviewing clients and witnesses.
- Students enrolled in the program complete a combination of legal specialty, business, liberal arts, and elective courses that will prepare them to work in many different law-related environments, including:
 - Law offices
 - Banks
 - Government agencies
 - Corporations

Internship Opportunities:

- PAL students have the option of participating in an internship after completing most of their law-related coursework.
- Internships typically take place in private law offices, but other internship sites have included:
 - Dutchess County Supreme Court;
 - Attorney General's Office;
 - District Attorney's Office;
 - Public Defender's Office; and
 - Legal Services of the Hudson Valley.

Where are they now? - AAS Graduates:

- Most AAS graduates either work in private law offices or continue their education by transferring and completing a four-year degree in paralegal studies.
- Some students plan to go on to law school:
 - No specific undergraduate major is required for law school, but a paralegal degree will enable a student to master the basic legal research and analysis skills that are required to succeed in law school.
 - Law school is an additional three years of study (if going full-time) after the completion of a four-year (bachelor's) degree.
 - The LSAT (Law School Admission Test) is a standardized exam that must be taken in order to apply for law school.

Transfer Opportunities:

- Although the PAL program is an occupational program, transfer opportunities do exist to obtain a four-year degree in paralegal studies
- If you wish to compete in an urban job market such as Westchester, NYC, or Albany, you likely will need a four-year degree
- There are multiple schools in New York that offer Bachelor's programs in Paralegal/Legal Studies:
 - SUNY Canton (Canton)
 - CUNY College of Technology (Brooklyn)
 - Hilbert College (Hambert)
 - Hofstra University (Hempstead)
 - Manhattanville College (Purchase)
 - Mercy College (Dobbs Ferry)
 - St. John's University (Jamaica)

Paralegal Certificate Program (PLL):

- The PLL program is a concentrated (one-year) certificate program that is designed to provide students with a basic foundation of legal skills and knowledge.
- This program is not recommended for students who have no legal or educational background; it is mainly intended for individuals who have prior education and work experience and are looking to make a career change.
- It also can provide the basis for a change in job title and/or a raise for those already working in the field.
- All courses in the PLL program will fold into the PAL program, so students in the certificate program can easily continue their studies and obtain a paralegal AAS degree.
